Setting up national qualification and training scheme for craftsmen in the Czech Republic and developing the further offer of training courses in Slovakia, Austria and Bulgaria.

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1 Executive summary

The Deliverable *D1.2 Workshops of partners with main stakeholders and with mobilized key market actors* provides the results of meetings with stakeholders, most relevant for the project activities, in two main target countries, Czechia and Slovakia.

At each project milestone, the partners have organised consultations with key actors at national level to review external factors of successfully rolling out and performing the project actions. This has insured an active involvement of stakeholders into the project activities. The workshops at national level related to the results of the bilateral meetings with main stakeholders were organised as a part of the Deliverable 6.1 Meetings of the stakeholders' dialogue. The results of the consultations and workshops were analysed and incorporated into the project activities, insuring an adequate response to the stakeholders' needs.

The full list of stakeholders, with whom the project consultations were organised, is contained in an Excel file that constitutes an internal and confidential appendix to this deliverable.



2 Stakeholder identification and engagement

Several key national stakeholders have been already identified during the preparation phase of the project. Among them are 18 organisations that expressed their interest to participate in the project by delivering a Letter of Support. On top of that, the most relevant stakeholders have been identified within the task 6.1.1 Identifying major stakeholders. The key actors were categorised in the following categories:

- A - policy makers;
- B – companies and owners;
- C – associations and chambers;
- D - educational institutions;
- E - other organisations.

The main objective of the consultations with stakeholders at national level is to attract relevant actors so that they are acquainted with the project, participate in the project's activities organised for the stakeholders, and, if relevant, become active users or promoters of the training content developed within the project.

All national partners are experienced entities with many contacts among potential stakeholders. The main activity of this task was, therefore, to address and establish cooperation with the stakeholders in existing networks, rather than search for key actors, unknown before.

Each group of stakeholders was contacted with a tailored key message. Three means of communication were chosen for the consultations – online, face-to-face or phone call. The most important actors were engaged directly through a bilateral one-to-one meeting. Based on the meetings held, the stakeholder database has been completed - the entries were filled in an Excel table.

3 Stakeholders' consultations

This section summarizes stakeholder consultations held by the national partners. First, overall statistics and description of the types of stakeholders, chosen for the consultations, are presented and followed by two country sections, which gives an overview of stakeholders, engaged through bilateral consultations and, subsequently, on project workshops, in the target countries.

The following general agenda was developed by the partners for a stakeholder meeting and tailored to each type of stakeholder before the meeting.

General agenda of a stakeholder meeting

1. Importance and objectives of CraftEdu project.
2. Meaning of European projects in the preparation of craftsmen for the energy transformation in construction sector.
3. Buildings' energy efficiency programmes.
4. The position of craftsmen in the Czech Republic/ Slovakia.
5. nZEB standard in craftsmen education.
6. Training materials and e-learning offered by CraftEdu.
7. Needs of stakeholder related to CraftEdu.
8. Comments of the stakeholder to project activities.

After the consultations main outputs of the project were adjusted to the needs and requirements of the stakeholders – the learning outcomes, scope and the content of the project training programmes were modified accordingly and afterwards presented and discussed at the workshops.

3.1 Overall assessment

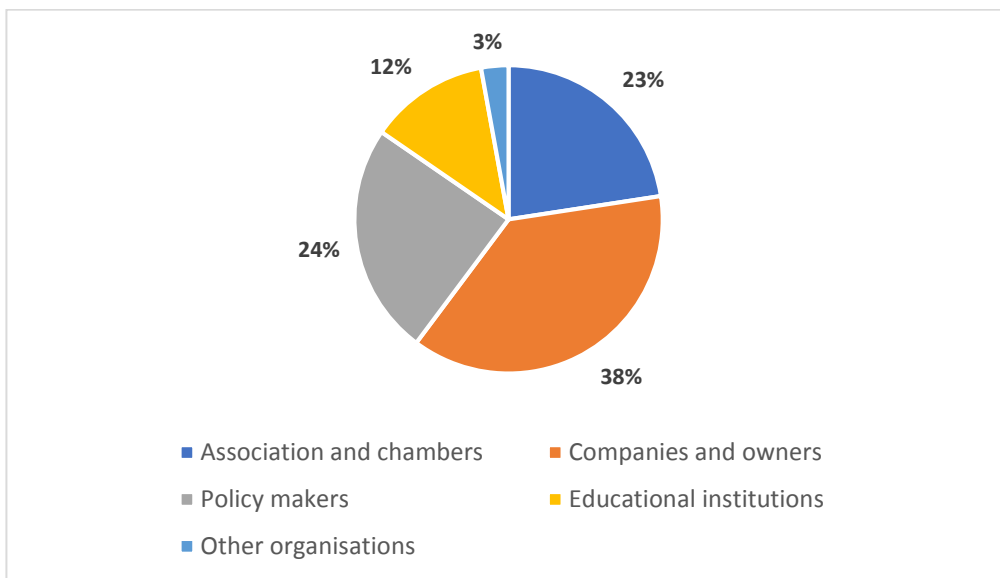


Figure 1. Classification of the stakeholders of the project.

In total 274 stakeholders of all categories were identified and engaged through bilateral meetings or online consultations in two main target countries. Of the five stakeholder categories, the majority of key actors are Companies and owners (category B) and policy makers (category A). Chambers and associations (Category C) also constitute a considerable part of the project stakeholders. The statistics of the types of engaged stakeholders are shown in Figure 1.

Most of the consultations with stakeholders were held as a face-to-face meeting, using the advantages of personal contact, which is still hard to replace. Only 3% of the consultations were held by means of a phone call.

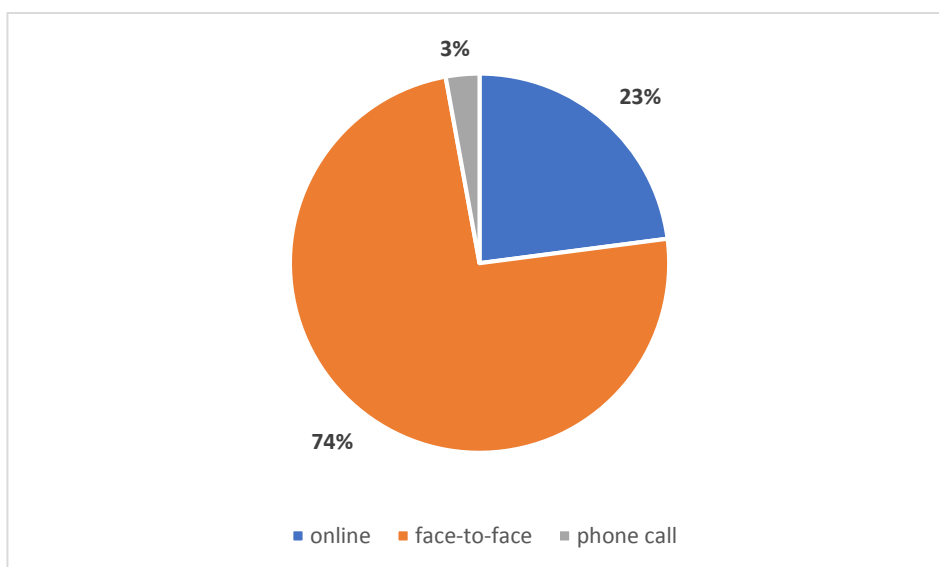


Figure 2. Means of communication with stakeholders.

3.2 Czech Republic

The bilateral meetings in Czechia were organised based on the experience and long-lasting partnerships of the project partners with different types of institutions. Consultations with 224 main stakeholders took place. They are distributed in the five selected categories as follows:

- A - policy makers – 41;
- B – companies and owners – 99;
- C – associations and chambers – 49;
- D - educational institutions - 29;
- E - other organisations - 6.

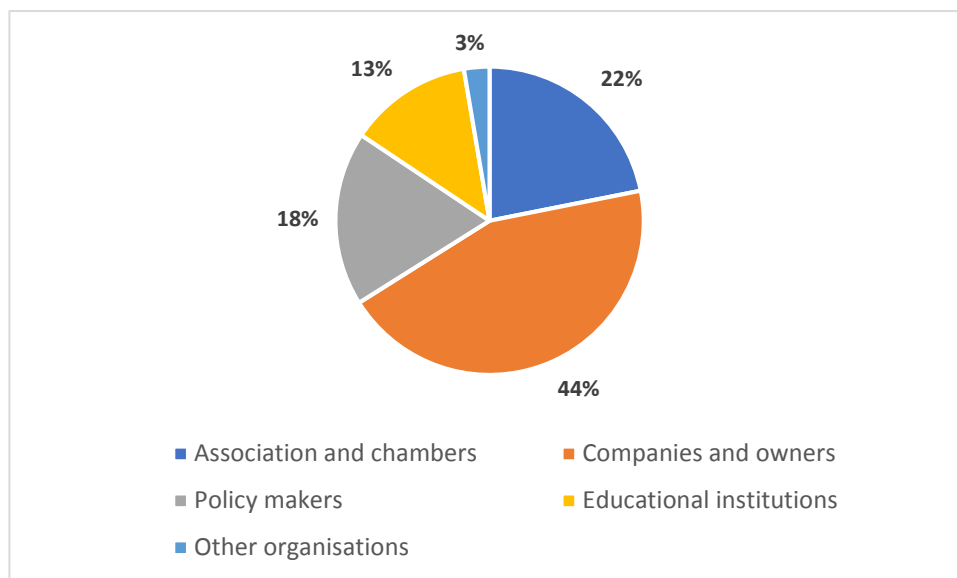


Figure 3. Classification of the stakeholders in Czechia.

In Czechia the focus was made on involvement of companies and professional associations and chambers into the project, as these types of stakeholders include the largest number of professionals with a need in professional upskilling provided by the project. Consultations organised with policy makers had a significant importance for the opportunity of incorporation of the developed training content into the current system of professional education.

3.3 Slovakia

In Slovakia bilateral consultations with 55 main stakeholders took place. Most of bilateral meetings were organised with policy makers, as the relevant companies were mainly addressed on regular meetings of the Association of construction entrepreneurs of Slovakia (ZSPS). Recommendations of professional associations and chambers had also an important influence on the development of training content within the project.

The stakeholders are distributed in the five selected categories as follows:

- A - policy makers – 27;
- B – companies and owners – 6;
- C – associations and chambers – 14;
- D - educational institutions – 6;
- E - other organisations - 2.

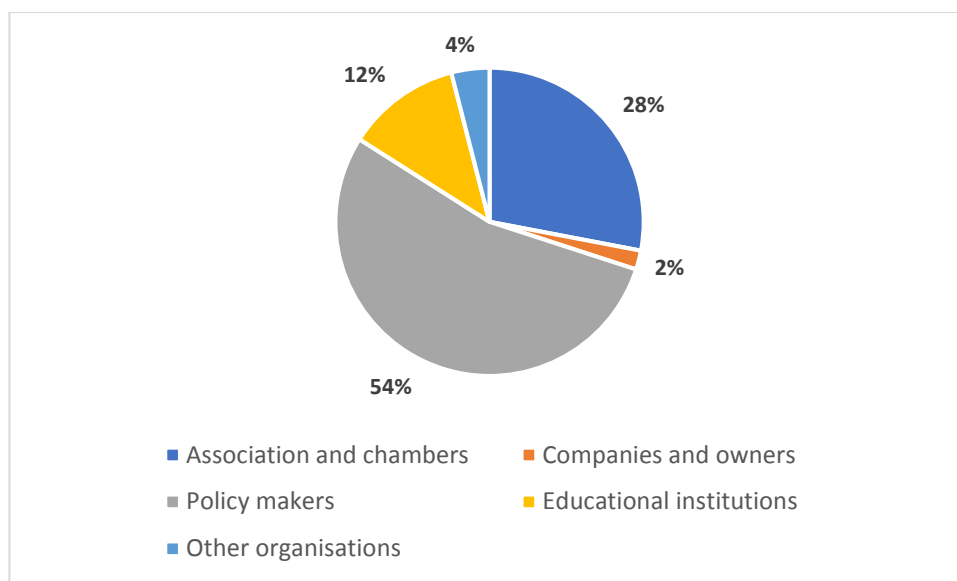


Figure 4. Classification of the stakeholders in Slovakia.

5 Conclusions

In two main target countries, 274 stakeholders were identified and engaged through bilateral meetings or online consultations. The majority of these key actors are Companies and owners (category B) and Policy makers (category A). Chambers and associations (Category C) also constitute a considerable part of the project stakeholders.

Based on the stakeholder consultations and workshops quite considerable changes were made in the initial scope and content of the project training programmes. Based on the results of the meetings with professional associations, an additional training programme was developed for the profession of Window installer; the content of training materials for the Carpenter was significantly modified (see also D4.1 Pilot training courses in Czech Republic). The developed training content was applied in the project of the CZ Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs Competence 4.0, focusing on maximizing the opportunities offered by the fourth Industrial Revolution (Industry 4.0) to the labour market in the Czech Republic.

Units of Learning Outcomes (D2.1) and Pilot training courses in Slovakia (D4.2) were adjusted to the requirements of professionals, construction companies' management, and unions and associations. Thanks to the stakeholders' recommendations, the quality of training and e-learning content has substantially increased in the course of the project and now corresponds at greater extent to the current needs of construction sector in upskilling of professionals.
